

Holly Cannill, who is 13, does gymnastics in her spare time. She decided to take up the sport because she wanted to keep fit and she's been keen on gymnastics since she was little. She has been doing it for ten years, and the furthest place she's been to is London, but will be going to compete in China in 2009. She uses equipment including the floor beam, bars and the vault. Her favourite thing to do on the floor beam is a back somersault; on the bars she likes doing the 'baby giant'; and on the vault a handspring. Holly is the under 16 Olympic champion for the Special Olympics. Her mom teaches her own classes in Fife which are held in the Tyne Hall, and has over 200 students.

Holly trains six days a week, and usually spends around three to four hours practising each night. She thoroughly enjoys it because it's good fun, but she's not sure if she wants to do it for a career. To people interested in participating in gymnastics, Holly advises you to enjoy yourself, and listen carefully to the instructions and advice they are given.

Krisia and I go to Tang Soo Do which is a martial art. We have been doing it for over four years. Krisia is a blue belt and I'm a red tag. When you start as a beginner, you are a white belt, and then you go onto white tag, orange belt, orange tag, green belt, green tag, brown belt, brown tag, red belt, red tag, blue belt, and then black belt. After you achieve the black belt, you can teach the class, and then you can progress to first dans, second dans and third dans. Grading is done every three months; this is where you move up a belt but to do this you have to know your form and bong form. Your form is a routine, as is your bong form. A bong is a long kind of stick which is classed as a weapon. Our instructor is Wilma McGregor and she teaches in KCS on a Tuesday and in the Legion Hall on a Thursday. It's up to each individual whether they want to enter any competitions. On the 29th of October I went to Smithton which is near Inverness, to compete for the first time. I ended up getting two trophies: a third for my form and a third for my sparring (fighting).

## Rock Challenge 2006

This year over 80 students participate in the global Rock Challenge which is a drug and alcohol free experience where students experience the natural high of performing arts. After the performance we waited nervously for all the other schools to perform and for the results. We were awarded 3 awards for Best Choreography, Best Lighting Design and Spirit of Rock Challenge. We were also awarded second place which was a huge achievement for KGS. This day will never be forgotten and will stick in many hearts forever.



## Vocational Curriculum

This year KGS became one of the first schools in Ayrshire to offer a vocational curriculum to senior school students. A partnership was formed with Banff and Buchan College to support the delivery of these courses. Courses which can be taken include hairdressing, mechanics, care, and rural skills and a total of forty three pupils started off the curriculum in August 2005. Since the completion of the school's extension, the school boasts a dual-purpose built hairdressing salon, drama studios, which has been put to great use by the hairdressing students. Each week, vocational pupils spend two days in a training programme, one day on work placement, and two days in school, undertaking courses to enhance their core and entrepreneurial skills. In the future, the school hopes to expand the number of courses to include courses like skills for Work, Construction Crafts.



## Little Shop of Horrors

On the 7th, 8th, and 9th of December 2005, Keith crowds were wowed by fantastic performances in the school's rendition of "The Little Shop of Horrors." A vast number of students donned costumes and make up to present the musical comedy, put together in a joint effort from both the English and Music departments.

## Surgical Skills Competition



In a nationwide campaign to promote the surgical profession, the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh held a Schools' Surgical Skills competition, which was open to schools all over Scotland. The competition also commemorates the 500 years of surgery at the College and was held in Edinburgh. Around 200 teams attended the event.

RGS were represented by Lauren Kennie and Gillian Robertson, both 6th years. The pair first travelled to Edinburgh in September, and learned skills involving suturing, plastering and keyhole surgery techniques which won them a place in the semi-final.

Held in January, the semi-final saw a total of 20 teams use the skills they had been taught in the heats to attempt slightly harder procedures, including suturing a severed pig's tendon. The girls made it through to the final along with six other teams.

At the final, which was held in April, teams were permuted spectators, and the duo was joined by their mums, Mrs Easton and Mrs Harper. During the event, which was much harder, the tasks included plastering each others' foot, suturing a damaged bowel, and using keyhole surgery techniques once more to remove a gall bladder from the surface of liver. All of the suturing and keyhole surgery procedure used prosthetics, which were very similar in look, size and texture when compared to the real thing, according to the competition's tutors, who were practising surgeons.

After a nail-biting finish, the team came third, winning £25 for the school, and also vouchers, a book and a mug each.

Both girls were delighted to have done so well, and decide that the money should be used for new equipment in the 6th year chemistry lab.

## Last Word

**B**ooks have been written about it. Songs from around the world and in all ages have been composed about it. It shows itself in many forms, from the breakup of a relationship, to the graveside service, to the retirement of a teacher, to the moment of emigration and to the departure of a group of sixth year. It did however open up new vistas for groups of intrepid explorers from darkest Drummar, from deepest Rothiemay, from the sophisticated boulevards of Keish and Fife Keith, from downoyer Newmill and the rolling acres of Grange. They also came from places which used to have Primary Schools of their own: places like Boharm and Forgue, like Silvearn and Ternemary, like the Glen and Tam o'rons.

And who were these pilgrims, voyaging to the legendary portals of KGS, seeking enlightenment? To categorise them would be to misrepresent them. They came from different backgrounds bearing different attitudes and personalities. They threw themselves into the blender and liquidiser of secondary education, and have emerged, much changed, in all the superficialities but still essentially each individual, cherished self. In their time at KGS they have done great things. They have been given the opportunity to experiment with life and to take their experience with them.

We shall miss them. We wish them well, and hope that the future gilds them with glory. We also hope that, for all time, some corner of their consciousness holds these rose-tinted images of their adolescence at KGS.
